McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act

The McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act can help provide school stability for your child if you do not have a permanent home and are:

- ⇒ Staying with friends or family because you lost housing.
- ⇒ Living in a shelter, including transitional programs.
- ⇒ Staying in motels because you cannot get your own home.
- ⇒ Living on the streets, in a car, van, tent or other nonpermanent structure.

As an eligible student, your child can:

- ⇒ Receive a free, appropriate public education
- ⇒ Enroll in school immediately, even if lacking documents normally required for enrollment.
- ⇒ Enroll in school and attend classes while the school gathers needed documents.
- ⇒ Enroll in the local school or continue attending your school of origin (the school you attended when permanently housed or the school in which you were last enrolled), if that is your preference and is feasible.
- ⇒ Receive transportation to and from the school of origin, if requested
- ⇒ Receive educational services comparable to those provided to other students, according student need
- ⇒ Receive free meal benefit services without an application
- ⇒ Receive assistance with school fees

Call 211 if you are a resident of Montgomery County and need housing.

The Your Way Home (YWH) Call Center is a centralized system for screening and intake for Montgomery County residents in need of housing.

Instead of calling individual shelters, those experiencing homelessness or those at-risk of becoming homeless can call one toll-free number and may be connected to appropriate services.
